Steam a Seam, Heat and Bond, come in different weights, make sure to check and get what you need.

The heavier fusibles are good for bags and boxes, items that need to hold their shape. There are many new names on the market, so check them out and see how they work before you get started.

Challenges and Committees do have something in common. They both take some time to work on, to follow through with but they can give to you something worth while to do and help the Guild.

We will be looking for some people to help on the Executive, Vice-President and Treasurer. Committees, Programs, and Workshops, also someone to organize placemats for next year, and Nautical Days this summer.

Artfully quilted pet portraits - re-creating portraits of our beloved fur children in fabric and thread. The supply list and the revised photo Instructions are posted on the workshop page of the guild website.

Fri. & Sat., May 4 – 5, SUSAN PAYNTER – BARK AND BRANCHES – 10 am – 4 pm each day \$125 PLUS A KIT FEE

In this class, you'll create a realistic tree with bark and branches done in a variety of materials. This will be a small wall hanging size project, approximately 18" x 14".

Susan has been busy snow dying background fabric and ordering & collecting goodies for the kits. Your kit will include materials needed for your project. It's a good idea for students to bring some thread, including invisible thread if you don't want your stitches to show, along with some greens, browns, greys....earthy woodsy tones like you would see in a forest..... Also, when you pack up your machine, please make sure you bring your free motion foot. We'll be contacting you soon to collect the kit fee for this class.

CAMP HOMEWOOD RETREAT

Mark the Dates . . . our next Camp Homewood retreat is scheduled for October 17th – 21st, 2018. We have found the *four* day retreat provides us with lots of valued time for sewing and socializing. Please note this retreat will run from 11am Wednesday to 11am Sunday. Sign up will start at the June business meeting. If you do not feel you can attend for a full four days please do not let that deter you from registering as it is a possibility for some of you to attend for three days only.

Depending on sign-up numbers we will also have the option of opening up the guesthouse for more private rooms. For further details concerning the guesthouse please speak to one of the retreat coordinators listed below. The cost per individual for the *four* days will range from \$252. to \$305., depending on the room you choose. The starting range of \$252. is a bunk style dorm room which sleeps up to 7, however on average there are usually anywhere from 2 to 5 in these rooms. Individuals in these rooms have shared bathroom/shower facilities. There is a separate handicapped washroom available to any that may require ease of access to toilet or shower. There are also newer rooms available which sleep up to 3 and have their own washroom, including shower/tub. These rooms are either \$287. with 3 sharing the room or \$305. with only 2 sharing. All prices include 3 meals a day along with snacks in the evening consisting of cookies/squares, fruit, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. The meals at Camp Homewood are excellent . . . and you will never walk away hungry!

If you have never been to a retreat at Camp Homewood we urge you to give it a try. It is a lot of fun and a great way to get to know your fellow quilters. Over the past couple of years we have seen a number of quilters who have attended retreat for the first time, and we continue to see more of them becoming regulars . If you wish to sign-up or for further information please contact one of the retreat coordinators listed below. Our contact details can be located on the guild website under "retreats" or by viewing the membership list.

Dates for February 2019 retreat to be announced at a later date. We look forward to seeing some new members as well as all of our regulars at one of the upcoming retreats.

Please note the rates quoted above are subject to change, as there is usually a slight increase each October.



Book Review

Embellish with Anything
Gladys Love
C+T Publishing 2009
Guild Library #207

I'm sure all members of our guild are aware of the CQA Postcard Challenge, with celebrating the natural beauty of Canada being the theme. Not only are there very nice prizes to be awarded, but the postcards will be displayed at Quilt Canada 2018 and will be for sale for \$5.00 each, proceeds going to the BC Children's Hospital. A win/win situation for everyone who enters a postcard in this challenge!



Why the above 'plug' you may ask? Gladys Love's book, "Embellish with Anything" is a fabulous resource. She has done a lot of ATCs (Artist Trading Cards) in the book, with wonderful photos, instructions, ideas.....but increase the size to 4" x 6", and you will be making a postcard. Gladys was a guest at a Guild meeting several years ago and we spent an hour marveling at her creations. Now if you borrow her book from our library, you will get an idea of how art can be easily created in small doses.

As with most good instruction books, this one gives basic information on inspiration, supplies and techniques used by the author. Finishing the edges, cutting and piecing curved seams as well as making double-fused fabric and simple beading are all covered near the beginning. Next comes the 'fun' part, using findings and nonfabric items (ephemera) to add to the cards. Wine labels to sushi wrap all contribute to unique projects. Wonderful photos and instructions guide you to creating you own cards.

Making fabric beads covers one chapter. In this you learn how to create rolled, glued, felted and melted beads. Next comes a chapter on how to bead a printed fabric, along with additional free-motion and satin stitching. A chapter called 'Beaded Goddess Postcards' offers yet more ideas, while the 'Painted Hibiscus Postcard' chapter offers step by step instructions on painting fabric, free-motion stitching, beading and satin stitching. For those who aren't into painting fabric, what about making 'Fused Landscape Postcards'?

Leaving behind ATCs and postcards, the author has larger projects, such as gingko leaf and dragon fly hangings. Journal covers, luggage tags and collage hangings are all accompanied by excellent instructions and photos. Finally, a gallery of "from small to wall" hangings should really tweak our interest, especially as you will recognize the names of several local quilt artists whose work is displayed.

A 4" x 6" postcard won't take as much time, energy and money to create as will a queen size quilt. Consider entering the Postcard Challenge now that you have so many great ideas from "Embellish with Anything" to get you started. Good Luck!
