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Workshop News December 2021

I would like to thank Raelene for agreeing to join the Workshop Committee! She is also planning to do our first workshop, here in the hall, in January 2022. It will be a

Wine Bottle Carrier that can be completed in class. Her Wine Bottle carrier has been very popular, and Raelene has made many of them, so she has lots ideas and advice for your project. If you are interested in joining this workshop, please sign the sheet at the back of the hall on Thursday. Details of dates and costs will be available soon. There are also lists for a Mystery Quilt and a Focus Day for Breast Cancer Bags. If you're interested in joining any of these workshops in the new year, please add your name to the lists so we can take our plans forward.



As we begin again with workshops for our guild, I read the Guild Policies for workshops on the website: The role of this committee is to organize workshops for the benefit of members that cover a

variety of interests and quilting abilities. So, I decided to speak to members who attended recent sew days to find out how the committee could go about meeting these goals here in late 2021 and beyond.

Of the 40 members I spoke to, 28 had some Zoom experience. With technology, there are always pros and cons: members said it had enabled them to see people in real time; do workshops, retreats, exercise, attended meetings and enjoy family chats. But Zoom meetings require good management and etiquette to be effective. Apart from any technical issues, members said it was less successful for the personal and social interaction we enjoy at in-person gatherings and workshops. People said: it wasn't spontaneous; people couldn't talk to each other. They missed the personal interaction, inspiration and sharing.

When asked about comfort levels attending in-person classes, based on the current COVID protocols here in the hall, 32 of the 40 interviewees said yes, they would be comfortable. 4 said it might depend on class size. 3 were maybes.

What kind of classes would members like to see going forward? My respondents gave me a list of about 20 topics that truly reflect the variety of our members' interests and enthusiasm for quilting: Skills classes, new and refreshers, quilt as you go, walking foot quilting. Art quilts, landscape quilts and smaller projects to make in a class. Crazy quilts, scrap quilts, mystery quilts. Thread play, free motion quilting, hand quilting. Bag making. And a little outside the box – a quilting bee; focus days; healthy sewing and taking care of your machine.

Finally, when asked if they would attend a Zoom class if one was available, 24 members said they would attend, or would attend if it was a topic of interest and was it well managed.

So what's the bottom line? We are as enthusiastic as ever about learning more about our craft. We all know that along with the benefits of learning new skills and techniques, workshops offer the benefits of inspiration, spontaneity and sharing with each other.

Previously our workshops have been in person, in the hall. And our future workshops will reflect that. However, I would like to find some live on-line workshops for our members with interesting topics hosted by experienced instructors – and there are some out there! - that open up the possibilities of the new quilting universe in 2021.

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Block 11 Dorothy's Star



This makes a 12" block !



** Supplies List **



Colour 1

Colour 1 needs: one 2" x 16" strip AND one 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strip AND two 2" x 4" strips



Colour 2

Colour 2 needs: one 5-1/4" x 10-1/2" strip




Colour 3


Colour 3 needs: one 5-1/4" x 10-1/2" strip AND one 1-1/2" x 16" strip AND one 2" x 16" strip AND two 2" x 7-1/2" strips AND one 1-1/2" x 4" strip

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
** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **




Start by marking and cutting the Colour 2 and Colour 3 5-1/4" x 10-1/2" strips into two 5-1/4" squares of each. Stack these and cut them on both diagonals to make eight quarter square triangles of each...



Now sew together the Colour 1 2" x 16", the Colour 3 1-1/2" x 16" and the Colour 3 2" x 16" strips along one long edge in a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams to darker side. Mark and cut this at 2" intervals...



Next sew together the two Colour 3 2" x 7-1/2", and one Colour 1 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strips along one long edge in a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams to darker side. Mark and cut this at 1-1/2" intervals...



Then sew together the two Colour 1 2" x 4" and one Colour 3 1-1/2" x 4" strips along one long edge in a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams to darker side. Mark and cut this at 2" intervals...



Using strips from the first and second strip sets we cut, make four of the block's corner units.

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Using two strips from the third strip set we sewed and one from the second set, sew one center unit as shown at left...



Now sew four of each of the quarter square triangle pairs shown at far left. Join them to make the block's four side units...



Lay out all your units as shown at left. Press row seams in alternating directions. Sew three horizontal rows. Join those rows, and the block is complete! :0)

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If you have ordered thread before (from Ardythe) you know the process.

If not here is some information.

Two types of thread are available – 100% cotton and 100% polyester. The spools hold 6000 yards for cotton thread and 6000 meters for polyester thread. The colour choices for the cotton thread are a bit limited with only 33. The polyester has more of a colour selection with over 100. A colour chart is available for your choices. Arrange with Marlene to view the colour chart.

You can contact Marlene at her e-mail (marlene@mthooper.ca), to place your order. To best reduce costs – she will wait until there are at least 10 orders before the order is placed.

It's another attractive block, and I'm pleased with the colours and the contrast between them in my sample.

The main details to watch out for, I think are:

When cutting the strip sets into sections, keep an eye on which are subcut into 2 inch pieces, and which are subcut into 1.5 inch pieces - they look so similar.

And watch the layout of the hourglass pieces, I managed to get one wrong way round, and had to unpick.
