Community Quilts News - January 2022

Community Quilters were busy delivering quilts before Christmas. Coby Sherstone and Lois Warner, of the Baby Group, delivered 20 baby quilts to the Health Unit on Dec. 8. Nerissa Thomas delivered 12 quilts to The Views and 4 quilts and 12 knitted baby toques to the Pregnancy Care Centre. Nerissa also presented a Quilt of Valour in December. Barb Bocking took 25 quilts to The Transition Society - making sure the children there had quilts for Christmas.

We had raffle tickets available at the guild sale in November, as well as for sale during the month of November. The winning ticket was drawn at the business meeting on Dec. 2, and the winner was Nerissa Thomas.

Nerissa has generously donated the quilt and pillow back to Community Quilts to be donated. We sold 326 tickets @ \$2.00 each. Our profit was \$652.00 minus expenses (ticket printing and gaming license). Thank you to all who bought tickets and the Venue Committee for suggesting the raffle.

Batting

There is batting available for Community Quilt projects, both in the storage room at the hall and at Jean Lewis' house, in East Courtenay. We have ordered an additional 2 bolts of batting, which should arrive sometime in January.

1- package (18.25 oz/S15g) lemon cake mix

1 egg

1/2 cup melted butter (125 ml)

1 tsp. Grated lemon zest (5ml)

Granulated sugar

TIPS

When grating lemon use only the coloured part. The white underneath has a bitter flavour. You can mix easily with an electric mixer on low speed for 1 minute

Preheat oven to 350F or 180 C Grease baking sheets

- 1. In large mixer bowl combine cake mix,egg, melted butter and lemon zest. Mix with wooden spoon till well blended.
- 2. Shape dough into 1 inch (2.5cm) balls. Place on prepared sheets.2 inches apart, press flat with a glass dipped in sugar Bake one tray at a time for 10-12 minutes or until lightly brown around the edges.

Cool on baking sheets for 1 minute or until firm, then remove to wire racks to cool completely.

Variation: Make into sandwich cookies filling with lemon icing or raspberry jam. Thanks Anita

Price of Quilt Fabric Increases

Along with many others, I have noticed an increase in quilt cotton prices over the past year. I spent some time researching why the prices increased and found it is a case of a 'perfect storm' of three main reasons.

Reasons:

20% of the world's cotton products are produced in Xinjiang, China which is known for human rights violations of the Muslin Uighur population which our Canadian government has called a genocide. The US has banned imports of cotton and cotton products from the region and Canada has banned imports of goods produced by slave labour.

Weather – India, China and Pakistan have been experiencing difficult weather

COVID – supply and pricing
Supply chain issues
Covid restraints for production

Jaftex, one of the largest quilt fabric manufacturing companies in the US has a blog post where the CEO explains the cost increase. A 20% per yard increase he pays for the product leads to a 50% increase in what he sells it for. Our local quilt shop also has to increase the cost to stay in business. He uses a \$1/yd for simplicity

I don't see quilting cotton prices stabilizing as just in one-year, raw cotton prices have increased 84% from 51.15 cents to 80.65 cents a pound. (March 2020-March 2021). This may be all the reason I need to increase my 'stash' at home.

She has taught for Quilt Canada, the Saskatchewan Stitches Conference as well as guilds across Canada. Since June 2020 she has been teaching online throughout North America, including Virtual Quilt Festival and Road@Home.

In **Modern Walking Foot Quilting with Melissa Marginet**, you will create samples of walking foot designs to help you understand what makes each design successful. *** President's Challenge ***

Each participant in this year's challenge will draw 2 different crayons from a paper bag at upcoming guild sewing days or the December meeting. Using these two colours – including tones and/or shades of the colours – and a neutral colour such as white, cream, grey or black if you wish - create a quilt with a minimum size of 14" X 14" – it can be larger. The fabrics can be solids or prints (not multi-coloured, no other colours to be introduced).

The quilt must have a top, batting and backing and it must be bound.

Deadline for finishing the challenge quilt is the general meeting on May 5th, 2022.

There will be 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prize winners. The quilts will be displayed at the May meeting and the three winners will be invited to display their quilts at the Guild quilt show in May.

Block 12 Friendship Star



This makes one 12" block!



** Supplies List **



Colour 1 Colour 1 needs:

one 4-1/2" square AND one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip



Colour 2 Colour 2 needs:


one 4-1/2" x 18" strip AND one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Start by marking and cutting the Colour 2

4-1/2" x 18" strip into four 4-1/2" squares...



Speed piece the half squares by stacking a Colour 1 and Colour 2 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip right sides together and all edges aligned.

On the back of the top strip lightly draw in the 4-7/8" square line and draw in the diagonals as shown at left.

Now sew a scant 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the square line.

Cut apart on the square line and on the marked diagonals between the rows of stitching.

This will give you four half squares. Press seams to darker side. Trim these back to measure 4-1/2" if needed.



Now piece the block! Sew three rows, using all scant 1/4" seams, and pressing seams in alternating directions by row!


