

Five Generations of quilters by Joy Whitehouse

My granddaughter just graduated from university this year & spent some time with her family on Vancouver Island. While there she did some quilting with her mother. After seeing her finished quilt I suddenly realized that she was the fifth generation of quilters. Her mother is a wonderful quilter & has just purchased a long arm quilting machine. I am also a quilter belonging to the Schoolhouse Quilters & the Denman Island Guild.

Krystyn received some fabric for Xmas a few years ago & has been working on her quilt whenever she was home. She was finally able to finish it during her last visit home. I asked if she wanted to do more & she agreed that it would be fun, but at the moment she is busy looking for work & deciding where she will live.

This made me think about the other quilters in our family & I thought about my Mother & Grandmother.

My Mother sewed all our clothes but she also liked all forms of fabric art. She never had any lessons but could look at a picture & reproduce it whether rug hooking, embroidery work, or quilting. She made quilts for all nine of her grandchildren. They were all crib size & very much loved to the point that some were falling apart.

My Grandma made utility quilts that were used as blankets. I have one that has been registered with the Victoria guild. It was

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made from left over fabric from dresses she made for herself.

The binding on mine & one of my cousins was in tatters. I was able to find matching cotton & repaired them both. She made these in the late 1930's or early 1940's.

She had a loom set up in her living room & hand quilted them.


I hope everyone is having a good summer so far. Since Susie Singer is taking some time off, she asked if I could fill in for her.



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# **Block of the Month Block 6 Churn Dash**



This makes one 12" Block. This is traditionally done in two colours but this example is using three to help see the emerging patterns.

# **Supplies List for one Block**



Colour 1 Needs one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip & one 4-1/2" square



Colour 2 Needs one 2-1/2" x 18" strip



Colour 3 Needs one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip AND one 2-1/2" x 18" strip

# **Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block**




Stack the Colour 1 and Colour 3 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strips, and using a rotary cutter, cut these together into two 4-7/8" squares of each.

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Using the rotary cutter again, cut the 4 4-7/8" squares on the diagonal, being careful not to stretch the fabrics...






Next, sew these triangles together, right sides together, using scant 1/4" seams to form four of these half squares. Press seams towards darker fabrics. Trim to 4-1/2" if needed...




Then, right sides together, sew the two 2-1/2" x 18" strips along one long edge using scant 1/4" seams. Press seams towards darker fabrics



Cut the resultant strip at 4-1/2" intervals into four 4-1/2" square pieced sections





Now sew all of these together, same 1/4" scant seams, in the order shown at left!

Have fun with this block and stay tuned for Block 7

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# **School House Thread Orders**

Did you know that the guild has access to a thread supply?

A Canadian company, CanSew, has been supplying us with Cone threads at wholesale prices.

Ardythe Crawford has been providing this service, usually once yearly, for the past 15 years. The guild would like to thank Ardythe for this service as she is retiring. Marlene Hooper has offered to take over for Ardythe.

If you have ordered thread before then you know the process. If not here is some information.

Two types of thread are available – 100% cotton and 100% polyester. The spools hold 6000 yards of thread. The colour choices for the cotton thread are a bit limited with only 33. The polyester has more of a colour selection with over 100. A colour chart is available for your choices. Arrange with Marlene to view the colour chart.



You can contact Marlene at her e-mail (available from the membership list), to place your order. To best reduce costs – she will wait until there are at least 10 orders before the order is placed. The wholesale cost per spool usually varies between \$30 - \$35 per spool for cotton thread and \$25 - \$30 for polyester thread.

A mandatory deposit of \$30 per spool for cotton thread and \$25 per spool for polyester thread will be required for the order. The final cost may vary – depending on the updated costs during these Covid times and the cost of shipping.

The delivery time is usually a few days – if the thread is in stock in Vancouver. Otherwise, the thread comes from Montreal and takes about a week.

Usually, Ardythe would bring the thread to the guild on Thursdays. Currently the thread pick up will have to be arranged between the purchaser and Marlene who lives in Courtenay, close to the Driftwood Mall.

Let Marlene know if you are interested.

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# **Comments for Block 6 BOM**

It is a nice simple block. My only comment is as before for the HST construction for the corner units:

For Colour 1 and Colour 3 cut one 5"x10" strip into two 5" squares.

On the back of the two lighter squares lightly mark the diagonal line.

Stack the Colour 1 and Colour 3 squares right sides together, and sew a scant 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals.

Cut these apart on the diagonals between the rows of stitching.

Trim to 4 1/2". This gives you four HSTs for the corner units.
