# Community Quilts News

The **Community Quilts Group** has had a busy and productive year. Despite the ongoing challenges of covid and the guild not meeting, we have managed to remain very active and connected – creating dozens of items for the community. Here is some of what we have achieved:

Transition Society – 35 adult quilts & 37 children's quilts donated

Seniors – 60 quilts

Cumberland Lodge - 9 quilts

Baby Group - 32 quilts

Vanier Toddlers - 10 quilts

Quilts of Valour – 3 quilts



Thank you Gladi for thinking of me, much appreciated.


This was a kit from Connecting Threads.

# **Block 5 Calico Puzzle**



This makes a 12" block! I'm doing this one in traditional piecing, making it a GREAT one for beginners!

# **Supply List is for one (1) 12" Block**



Colour 1 Colour 1 needs: one 4-1/2" square, AND one strip 4-7/8" x 9-3/4



Colour 2 Colour 2 needs: one strip 4-1/2" x 18"




Colour 3 Colour 3 needs: one strip 4-7/8" x 9-3/4"

# **Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block**






Mark and cut the Colour 1 4-7/8" x 9-3/4"strip into two 4-7/8" squares. Stack and cut these squares once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles




Next mark and cut the Colour 2 4-1/2" x 18" strip into four 4-1/2" squares...



Now mark and cut the Colour 3 4-7/8" x 9-3/4"strip into two 4-7/8" squares. Stack and cut these squares once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles...



Sew a Colour 3 half square triangle to a Colour 1 half square triangle, right sides together, using as SCANT 1/4" seam. Repeat this to make a total of four half square like this...



Now piece the block, using the diagram at left for placement and orientation of the units, using the Colour 1 4-1/2" square as the block's center. Make rows first, then join the rows, alternating pressing directions as you do this. All Done!!

If you have information that you think someone would bnefit from our best wishes please let me know.



# **School House Thread Orders**


Did you know that the guild has access to a thread supply?


A Canadian company, CanSew, has been supplying us with Cone threads at wholesale prices.

Ardythe Crawford has been providing this service, usually once yearly, for the past 15 years. The guild would like to thank Ardythe for this service as she is retiring. Marlene Hooper has offered to take over for Ardythe.

If you have ordered thread before then you know the process. If not here is some information.

Two types of thread are available – 100% cotton and 100% polyester. The spools hold 6000 yards of thread. The colour choices for the cotton thread are a bit limited





A mandatory deposit of \$30 per spool for cotton thread and \$25 per spool for polyester thread will be required for the order. The final cost may vary – depending on the updated costs during these Covid times and the cost of shipping.

The delivery time is usually a few days – if the thread is in stock in Vancouver. Otherwise, the thread comes from Montreal and takes about a week.

Usually, Ardythe would bring the thread to the guild on Thursdays. Currently the thread pick up will have to be arranged between the purchaser and Marlene who lives in Courtenay, close to the Driftwood Mall.

Let Marlene know if you are interested.

# Block of the Month from our testing crew

Clare's blocks & comments Calico Puzzle block #5

I enjoyed this traditional block design. My samples are below.

My comments are similar to last month, regarding the HST construction. I did mine using the method as follows (from previous block instructions):

For Colour 1 and Colour 3 cut one 5"x10" strip into two 5" squares. On the back of the two lighter squares lightly mark the diagonal line. Stack the Colour 1 and Colour 3 squares right sides together, and sew a scant 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals. Cut these apart on the diagonals between the rows of stitching. Trim to 4 1/2". This gives you four HSTs for the corner units.





**Jean's**; comments & Calico Puzzle

Block 5 – Calico Puzzle

- Quick & easy sew
- One change to directions for me The directions have you cut the squares and then diagonally cut to make into triangles but then direction says to sew colour 3 half square triangle to a colour 1 half square triangle when what it really wants you to do is to sew a colour 3 triangle to a colour 1 triangle to create half square triangles

# **Rhubarb Muffins**

It's rhubarb season and I decided to try making these muffins and so glad I did.

# Ingredients:

2 1/2 cups flour 1 tsp baking
-------------------------------

1 tsp baking soda 1/2 tsp salt

1 1/4 cups brown sugar 1/2 cup vegetable oil

1 egg 1 tsp vanilla extract

1 cup buttermilk 1 1/2 cups diced rhubarb

1/2 cup chopped walnuts (optional) 1 tbsp melted butter

1/3 cup white sugar 1 tsp ground cinnamon

### Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, grease two 12 cup muffin pans or line with paper muffin cups In a medium bowl, stir together flour, baking soda, baking powder & salt.

In a separate bowl, beat brown sugar, oil, egg, vanilla & buttermilk with an electric mixer till smooth. Add this to the dry ingredients and mix by hand till blended.

Stir in the rhubarb and walnuts.

Spoon the batter into the prepared muffin pan, filling almost to the top.

In a small bowl stir together melted butter, white sugar & cinnamon, sprinkle 1 teaspoon of this on top of each muff.

Bake in preheated oven until the tops of the muffins spring back when lightly pressed, about 25 minutes (depending on your oven).

Cool in the pans for 10 minutes before removing.
