BOOK REVIEW by Lois Warner

Four Seasons of Quilts: Garden - Inspired Projects Cori Derksen and Myra Harder Martingale Company 2003 Quilt Guild Library # 613




Spring has finally arrived, and what better way to celebrate than to create a project with spring/summer in mind? "Four Seasons of Quilts" has some lovely small and large projects, all inspired by the garden.

Before all the projects, there is a short section 'Getting Started', which assumes you have a basic knowledge of quilt making. Fabric choices, supplies, paper piecing, borders and applique briefly make up this section. There are additional hints about paper piecing and appliqueing curved pieces, which the authors have found useful over time. In addition, check out ideas on page 13 for using quilts on a table to match the theme of a party.

As with our calendar, the book begins with spring. Tulips are featured in 'Webster's Tulips', a square wall quilt with the look of a heirloom. As well, a sign or pillow could use the pattern for a lovely group of tulips.

Summer begins with a large bed quilt called 'Butterfly Blue'. Here hand or fusible applique can be used for the butterflies, while hand or machine quilting joins the layers together. What an appropriate symbol of summer! The use of the 'Storm at Sea' block, modified to create 'Petunia Picnic' is an intriguing use of an old quilting pattern. Dragonflies and flowers are combined in a simple baby quilt, which will never be out of date (pg. 52).

Since autumn and winter are a long way off, you may want to skip these projects in order to work on the spring/summer projects. However, pumpkins predominate in two simple projects - an "Autumn" sign and a baby quilt created for a baby born at this time of year. As well, the large quilt 'Autumn Joy' absolutely glows with fall colours (pg. 58).



And finally winter - 'Christmas Goose' using the 'Goose in the Pond' block doesn't necessarily have to be limited to winter. This quilt is fast and easy to piece together and with a change in colour could become a summery garden quilt. More typical of winter is the 'Holly and Berries' table runner, a foundation pieced crazy block and applique project using reds and greens. Finally, a sign 'Winter' features a snow covered bird house, awaiting spring.

The book ends with basic techniques for finishing the quilts. Included: are adding a hanging sleeve; blocking the quilt to ensure it will lie flat and signing the quilt. Detailed instructions are given on stretcher-bar framing of the four seasons signs.

A worthwhile book to borrow for inspiration to get stared on a seasonal project. The projects need not be dutifully made as directed. Personalize them with your own colours, desired size and method of construction. Happy Spring!

Camp Homewood Retreat – Fall 2019

Dear Miss Fussy Cut,

Do you have any tips for how to deal with carpal tunnel problems. It seems that quilters & knitters are prone to this syndrome.

Preventions ideas? Treatment?

Thanks!

Dear Miss Tingling Finger Tips & Burning Wrists,

You are absolutely right. As quilters and knitters, or anyone working with repetitive hand movements, we can get carpal tunnel syndrome.

Try not to sleep with your hands curled inwards at night. Get yourself a pair of wrist guards and get used to sleeping with them to give the wrist a chance to relax.

Stretch out your wrists by holding out your arm and pointing your fingers downward. Then on the inside of your elbow, gently pull upward with your other hand on your finger tips.

My biggest advice is to consult your doctor before it has gone too far.

Dear Miss Fussy Cut,


I think you are pretty "old school," so I'm a little worried about asking this question. It's kind of a question about...cheating!

I have heard that there is some way you can use invisible thread to make machine quilting look like hand quilting. Do you know anything about this?

Yours, Looking for a way to finish some guilts fast!

Dear Looking for a way,

You say "old school" like it is a bad thing!



There are some sewing machines that have a preset stitch that mimics hand quilting. This little diagram shows what the setting looks like on some machines.

This is done with monofilament thread on top and cotton thread in the bobbin. Depending on your fabrics, the upper thread tension is increased, so the bobbin thread is pulled to the surface



bobbin thread is pulled to the surface of your quilt.

When you're sewing using this method, it is best to slow your stitching down. This is so the monofilament threads don't snap.

Lage 17

COOKING WITH CARREEN

Someone at the guild was asking me about those desserts that 'magically' become a cake on the top and have a sauce on the bottom.. Here are two, and judging from the stains on one of the recipes, it is one I have made quite often.

Chocolate Brownie Pudding - This is very dense and very chocolaty. A little goes a long way.

- cup sifted all purpose flour
 teaspoons baking powder
 4 cup granulated sugar
 tablespoons cocoa powder
 teaspoon salt
 cup milk
 tablespoons oil (canola, safflower, NOT olive)
 teaspoon vanilla
 cup chopped walnuts or pecans (optional)
 4 cup brown sugar
 4 cups hot water.
 Oven 350 F, grease 8x8x2 inch baking pan.
- 2. Sift together the first five ingredients, then add milk, oil and vanilla. Mix till smooth.
- 3. Stir in nuts, if using, and pour the lot into the prepared pan.
- 4. Combine the brown sugar, 1/4 cup cocoa powder and the hot water, making sure cocoa is mixed well with no lumps.
- 5. Pour over the batter in the pan.
- 6. Bake for about 40 mins. If you overcook it, you get less sauce on the bottom, more brownie, less pudding!

Lemon Pudding Cake

3/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup sifted all purpose flour
3 tablespoons butter, melted
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1/4 cup lemon juice
1 1/2 cups milk
3 well beaten egg yolks
3 stiffly beaten egg whites

- 1. Oven 350 F. Grease 8x8x2 inch baking pan.
- 2. Combine sugar, pinch salt, and flour together, then stir in the melted butter, lemon peel and lemon juice.
- 3. Whisk milk and egg yolks together, before adding to the lemon mixture.
- 4. Whisk the egg whites in a clean bowl with a very clean whisk or electric mixer, and fold into the lemon batter.
- 5. Pour into the baking pan, and set this inside a larger, deeper pan on oven rack.
- 6. Pour hot water (from kettle) into the larger pan, about one inch deep.
- 7. Bake for 40 minutes. Serve warm or chilled.

If you are submitting something regularly to the newsletter, please send a new file of exactly what you would like to have in your section by the due date of the 15th of each month. There are a couple of reasons for this request:

- It's very time consuming to search through old files and working to a deadline does not allow for this. Most of the last minute changes that have had to be made before the newsletter is published are the result of outdated or inaccurate information being repeated, and sometimes these issues are missed. It's easy to overlook these issues when you are not part of the committee.
- Committee heads are the best people to help ensure that the newsletter information is accurate, complete and up-to-date.

The executive reviews the fee on an annual basis, depending on the rent charged per annum, from September 1 to August 31 of the following year.

The fee for the current year is \$60.00. When a new member joins, the membership fee is due when joining.

The renewal membership fee is due at the September general meeting (first Thursday of the month). If a member joins the Guild in May, June, July or August, the fee is applied to the next full year.
