

# Scraps, A Technique and A Project

## Mystery Class February 4, 2012

When I started this project I had on mind to make a quilt. The blocks are 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square and quilted as you go. So this works perfectly with putting your project together the reversible method. Make a few blocks now, make a few later. For those who wish to try this technique before committing to a quilt, instructions for placemats will also be given. Please call if any questions. Janis 337-8783.

You will need a variety of light, medium and dark 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Bring extra squares, as when we get started you may need to rearrange some.

Quilt - 40 - 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares will make two blocks

For a quilt approximately 40" x 60" or 4 blocks by 5 blocks you will need 400 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (choose your own size quilt if you wish)

Batting and backing - 20 15 x 15 inch squares

Sashing -.6m for the top and .75 for the back and .6m for binding, extra is always a good idea and some can be put into the 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to help tie everything together.

Placemats - 80 - 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares will make two placemats

Batting and backing 18" x 22" ( two pieces of each)

Binding .4 m

Thread to match your backing fabric (remember quilt as we go)

18 or 24 inch ruler, cutting mat, and rotary cutter.

Some type of marking pen

Machine in good working order and all your basic sewing supplies.
