President's Message

As I write this, I can tell you that our quilt show opens tomorrow. It was a long day today and my feet are tired. I should **not** complain. It was a **fantastic** day. What started as a large empty room became a very truly wonder filled showcase of the talent within our guild.

I got to the hall early to deliver my entries to the show. Many people had signed up for set up and our first task was to "bucket brigade" the 200 pieces of frames and rods out of our familiar work room, up the stairs and into the upper room. Slowly this brigade grew to 16 people. In under 30 minutes, all the pieces were ready for reconstructing the frames and sails. After a short lesson on how to put the 6 pieces of the frame and the sail together, we put 30 units together. They almost touch the ceiling.

With my floor plan in hand, and helpers with tape measure and masking tape, we marked where the corners and ends of frames were to sit. Frames were then carried to each location and the layout began to become a reality. Zap straps and sandbags served to make it all sturdy and untippable. Metal rods and their hardware were tightened and chains, S hooks and large C hooks readied for quilt hanging.

With lunchtime approaching, I directed all to have a lunch break and to resume at noon. Meanwhile Diana's entry-check in crew brought the 100

entries upstairs for hanging. During the morning, the Boutique group, Raffle Table, and Community Quilts also set up their areas. The Tea room crew, Raffle Baskets and Small Worx had to wait until their areas were free and available to complete their setup.

The Quilt hanging is a huge puzzle with largest quilts being hung first, medium next and then small quilts in the small spaces left. With a critical eye, quilts draped on rods were swapped out when they did not go well beside others around them. A Canadian theme greets guests at the first frame they will see. Items not suited to hanging were displayed on two tables. The men and one lady, on ladders, climbed up and down repeatedly as they hung the metal rods via S hooks, to the chains hanging from the frames.

The variety and quality of work is impressive. I hope you had the opportunity to enjoy it!

But, what impressed me the most, was the hard-working crew that I had the pleasure to work with. Despite difficult, and physical work, you never heard any



Book Review

Cozy Modern Quilts

23 Easy Pieced Projects to Bust Your Stash Kim Schaefer C+T Publishing 2009 Guild library #249

Kim Schaefer is the author of several quilting books, with this book being the simplest. Don't be deceived - it is a most engaging book to read, has wonderful photos and can be an inspiration for a quick and easy summer quilt.



The book starts with a short overview of "how to make a quilt", but soon gets into specific projects. Very simple rotary cutting of squares and rectangles produces stunning quilts of varying sizes. No curved piecing or applique here.

Through the use of simple shapes, clear diagrams for piecing, and suggestions of ways to vary the patterns, you can make the projects in short order. The idea of using a border makes for a more traditional quilt, while borderless gives a contemporary feeling.

The book consists mainly of projects, starting with lap quilts and going down in size to placemats. Although there are 5 table runner patterns, Kim assumes that a wall or lap quilt can be easily downsized to a table runner (or upsized to make a larger quilt). The possibilities are endless. This book came out before Kaffe Fasset prints came on the market, but the 'color splash table runner' (page 50) would look

fabulous in some of his fabrics.

The overall feel of a quilt can be changed dramatically by color choice. Using the same block, Kim shows us how a traditional feel is achieved through using soft classic combinations such as neutrals or blue/brown and tan. The same block becomes very modern when made in bright florals or rich jewel tones.

A thumbs up for this book if you are searching for a summer project. Lots to look at, think about, and make a decision! Even if the 6 placemats on page 55 don't inspire you (all being neutral), think of them in bright colors, ready for a bbq - what a great way to spend a summer evening.

CAMP HOMEWOOD RETREAT

The time has come to sign up for our next retreat which is scheduled for October $18^{th} - 22^{nd}$, 2017. We have found the *four* day retreat provides us with lots of valued time for sewing and socializing. Please note this retreat will run from 11am Wednesday to 11am Sunday. Sign up will start at the June business meeting. If you do not feel you can attend for a full four days please do not let that deter you from registering as it is a possibility for some of you to attend for three days only.

Depending on sign-up numbers we will also have the option of opening up the guesthouse for more private rooms. For further details concerning the guesthouse please speak to one of the retreat coordinators listed below. The cost per individual for the *four* days will range from \$252. to \$305., depending on the room you choose. The starting range of \$252. is a bunk style dorm room which sleeps up to 7, however on average there are usually anywhere from 2 to 5 in these rooms. Individuals in these rooms have shared bathroom/shower facilities. There is a separate handicapped washroom available to any that may require ease of access to toilet or shower. There are also newer rooms available which sleep up to 3 and have their own washroom, including shower/tub. These rooms are either \$287. with 3 sharing the room or \$305. with only 2 sharing. All prices include 3 meals a day along with snacks in the evening consisting of cookies/squares, fruit, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. The meals at Camp Homewood are excellent . . . and you will never walk away hungry!

If you have never been to a retreat at Camp Homewood we urge you to give it a try. It is a lot of fun and a great way to get to know your fellow quilters. Over the past couple of years we have seen a number of quilters who have attended retreat for the first time, and we continue to see more of them becoming regulars . If you wish to sign-up or for further information please contact one of the retreat coordinators listed below. Our contact details can be located on the guild website under "retreats" or by viewing the membership list.

For those of you who plan ahead the dates for our spring 2018 retreat are February 14^{th} – 18th, 2018. We look forward to seeing some new members as well as all of our regulars at one of the upcoming retreats.

hall is around the back. Not a huge parking lot so carpool if possible.


Cost: \$18.00 includes lunch, a trunk show by Daphne Greig, merchants and some great take homes!

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

WHITE (NOT Cream or Beige, can be white on white as long as it shows as white)

Cut 5 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Cut 4 squares 3" x 3"

Cut 1 square 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

RED

Cut 8 squares assorted reds 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Cut 4 squares assorted reds 3" x 3"

Cut 1 rectangle 1 1/2" x 7"

DIRECTIONS

Draw a diagonal line on white 3" x 3" squares. Place right sides together with red 3" x 3" squares. Sew a scant ¼" on both sides of drawn lines and cut on drawn line. Press and trim to 2 ½".

Turn under ¼" on long sides of red 1 ½" x 7" rectangle. Place diagonally on white 4 ½" square. Applique by whatever method you like.

Assemble maple leaf as per diagram.

Block should measure 10 ½" x 10 ½" unfinished.

Campbell River Friendship Quilters Guild Hands Across the Water 2017 Canada 150 Quilt Challenge

The theme of the challenge is Celebrate Canada 150. We are hoping to get lots of entries this year and hope you have fun depicting an aspect of Canada that you enjoy! The challenge is for quilted wall hangings.

Your quilt must

- Include a maple leaf in either the design or the quilting.
 It could be a Canadian Flag.
- Measure less than 150 inches around the perimeter (all sides added together).
- Examples of the largest measurements are a 37.5 inch x 37.5 inch square or a 30 inch x 45 inch rectangle or other rectangle adding up to less than that.
- Contain at least two of these features ocean, mountain, lake, tree, prairie, river, or beach.
- Please do an information sheet with the quilt name, your name, phone number and Guild name. Include acknowledgements (e.g. designer if not an original)
- Judging will be by viewer's choice.

The quilts will be displayed at Hands Across the Water on September 30, 2017 in Campbell River.

RHUBARB RELISH

1 quart of rhubarb finely chopped about 8 cups

4 cups brown sugar 1 quart chopped onion

2 cups white vinegar 1 tsp. Ground cloves

1 tsp allspice 1 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp red pepper flakes, ground, more if you like a little heat

1 tsp salt

Boil until thick—takes hours but you must stir often as it can burn to the bottom of the pot.

Place in sterilized jars, process 10 minutes Note, I always double this recipe


