Stitched Textiles: Birds

A number of members have seen my puffin picture, a project in this book. I found it enjoyable to make as the instructions and photos were so clear and very easy to follow. However, although there are six projects in the book, the author is really interested in getting you to make your own picture, rather than simply copying hers.

To begin with, sort through your fabric collection, pick up scraps from the "free table" - they may find a home in your picture. A variety of threads is essential for stitching down fabric scraps and adding lots of highlighting. The addition of "found objects" may add a lot to your work, too.

Design is important, and is treated as such. The author uses a sketch book to record ideas, a scrapbook of clippings from magazines and newspapers, reference books and blank paper to sketch out the main ideas. Artwork in museums, churches and art galleries can be inspirational. Color, in both fabric and thread are as important as the design.

The background, made up of small squares and rectangles, is first assembled on a piece of interfacing. Once the final arrangement is made, the fabric pieces are stitched down using decorative stitching. Next comes the foreground which will likely contrast with the background in order to stand out. Fusible web is used for the birds etc. in this book (with templates in the back of the book if you are making one of the projects). Through the use of stitching and a variety of fabric textures plus, perhaps, dyeing your own fabric, your picture will be exclusively—yours. How to display your masterpiece? Directions for mounting on canvas blocks (dollar store?) is effective. Or have it framed!

There are so many "tips" to guide you in creating a project. For example, in Project 2: Chickens, one tip is "Give a lot of care to how the legs, eyes and beaks sit. These features give a lot of the character. Try moving them around a bit and you will see the difference!"

From "Seagulls on a Boat" to "Bird Ark", this book is full of fun ideas. The three galleries of pictures throughout the book are jumping off points for more ideas. Hopefully this book will make you smile and realize you can do something with those little bits and pieces. Note, the pictures are generally about 12" x 12", so this can be small project which doesn't have to be perfect - no matching corners and 1/4" seams! Have fun!

Evergreen Hand Quilters

We are small group that does hand quilting on a large 4 board frame at the Filberg Center in Courtenay. Funds we collect are donated to the Center which provides many programs for seniors.

We receive a pieced top (no batik fabrics), batting and backing and hand quilting thread provided by the client.

Prices are based on a few factors. The first is size. Second is density of quilting. We measure the size and calculate the total area in square inches.

What this translates to is reflected in the list below. (This is between 2.5 cents to 3 cents per square inch.).

This chart gives you a **good approximation** of what you could expect to be charged.

Baby	30x40	1240 sq in	\$30-\$40
Throw	64x54	3456 sq in	\$85-\$100
Twin	70x90	6300 sq in	\$157-\$189
Double	80x90	7200 sq in	\$180-\$216
Queen	92x96	9720 sq in	\$243-\$291
King	108×110	11,880 sq in	\$297-\$356

The one thing we cannot promise is a date of completion. We quilt them in order received and are working on two quilts at once between our 5-6 members. **We are looking for new members**!

Have you heard ???

President's Challenge this year is the "HST"

(half square triangle – one of the most common, most versatile quilt blocks). What is your favorite layout for these? – stars? chevrons? flying geese? – or are you ready to try some new layout? Do you have a preferred method for trimming these to size? Sometimes, the options seem unlimited.

To Enter this year's President Challenge:

Register with Gayle Hampton – cost is \$ 5.00. If you complete your project by June, your \$ 5. is returned - --- but, if you don't – the money goes to Community Quilts

Use your scrap HST's from previous projects – or make new ones

Any size project will be accepted – as long as the main focus is HST (although you can include other blocks in your layout)

The Library has many MANY books / patterns to provide options and ideas for you.

Books can be signed out for 1 month periods – if you need to keep it longer, then please return it to ensure no one else has requested it – and then sign it out again.

To request a book – there are small post-it notes on the cupboard door – write your name on it and then stick it to the card in the sign out book
