### CAMP HOMEWOOD RETREAT

# The time is here to sign up for our next retreat which is scheduled for February 14<sup>th</sup> – 18th, 2018.

This will be a *four* day retreat which provides us with lots of valued time for sewing and socializing. **Please note this retreat will run from 11am Wednesday to 11am Sunday.** Sign up will start at the **December** business meeting. If you do not feel you can attend for a full four days please do not let that deter you from registering as it is a possibility for some of you to attend for three days only.

Depending on sign-up numbers we will also have the option of opening up the guesthouse for more private rooms. For further details concerning the guesthouse please speak to one of the retreat coordinators listed below.

The cost per individual for the *four* days will range from \$252. to \$305., depending on the room you choose. The starting range of \$252. is a bunk style dorm room which sleeps up to 7, however on average there are usually anywhere from 2 to 5 in these rooms. Individuals in these rooms have shared bathroom/ shower facilities. There is a separate handicapped washroom available to any that may require ease of access to toilet or shower. There are also newer rooms available which sleep up to 3 and have their own washroom, including shower/ tub. These rooms are either \$287. with 3 sharing the room or \$305. with only 2 sharing.

All prices include 3 meals a day along with snacks in the evening consisting of cookies/squares, fruit, coffee, tea, and hot chocolate. The meals at Camp Homewood are excellent . . . and you will never walk away hungry!

If you have never been to a retreat at Camp Homewood we urge you to give it a try. It is a lot of fun and a great way to get to know your fellow quilters. Over the past couple of years we have seen a number of quilters who have attended retreat for the first time, and we continue to see more of them becoming regulars. Please don't hesitate to ask us questions if you have any.



## **Book Review**

Stash-Buster Quilts Lynne Edwards Published by David & Charles 2006 Guild Library #350

Lynne Edwards should be a familiar name in the world of quilting. She is an English quilter with MBE after her name. MBE stands for "Member of the Order of the British Empire", an honor received from the Queen for a particular achievement. Obviously teaching quilting and writing quilting books has its rewards in Britain. We have a number of Lynne's books in our guild library. She



is also a regular contributor to the English magazine, "Today's Quilter", where her articles are very wide ranging, depending on questions sent in by readers.

"Stash-Buster Quilts" main emphasis is on using some of your fabric stash as quickly and easily as possible. Lack of mind numbing technical information makes this book user friendly and is a real inspiration to creating with some of that stash of fabric. As Lynne says "the longer a piece of fabric stays in a stash, the more it loses its power and attraction. It needs to be taken out, shaken, grouped with others that give it new life, as it gives new life to them. In other words we have to use some of our collection or it cannot grow and continue to give pleasure."

Old patterns such as log Cabin and Delectable Mountains are given a modern twist. All instructions are clearly written, with assembly line construction constantly used. Intriguing is Lynne's fast and accurate method of making 'corner square' blocks, two at a time. As well, the two at a time 'nine patch' cuts construction time to a minimum!

Throughout the book there are time saving techniques, shown by the use of an (Continued on page 8)

hourglass with a stop symbol printed on it. Pictures of sewing shears next to cutting or stitching information draws your attention to extra advice, reflecting the experience of the designer, and again, helpful when saving time and effort.

The 20 projects range in size from full size scrap quilts to stuffed pigs. Several variations of each project are often shown, giving a lot of ideas on use of color. Directions and diagrams are especially easy to follow, and a nice touch for each project is an explanation as to how and why this particular design came into being.

Lynne writes in a manner which is easy to follow. Tidbits of interesting background information are included and a bit of humor adds enjoyment when perusing this book. A definite 'thumbs up' for "Stash-Buster Quilts"

 $\star$  have some gold and blue in it


★ must not exceed 160 inches around the perimeter (all sides added together)
